

#FOMO – Part 2: It's Only Me Sunday, April 18, 2021

- What are some ways David leveraged his position as king to do what he wanted?
- How did David compound the negative decision-making throughout the story?
- Spend some time tracking variations of the word "sent" throughout the story and talk about how those decisions played roles in the storyline.
- Are there areas of life in which you are pulled to go it alone? What are they?
- When the story of your life is told, do you want it to be a go-it-alone or connected to God & others story?
- What next step will you take to pursue a connected rather than go-it-alone life?
