- Has there ever been a time when you tried to go in the opposite direction God wanted you to go? What was it? How did it work out for you?
- In the story, how are the members the ship's crew being introduced to Jonah's God? What do you think led to their shift in belief?
- What do you think about the time Jonah spent inside the great fish?
- Why do you think Jonah agreed to go to Nineveh the second time?
- Why do you think Jonah was so upset and angry when the people of Nineveh chose to believe in God?
- How do you respond to the description Jonah gives of God? Have you ever experienced these things from God?
- What are some ways God shows his compassion and love for people throughout the story of Jonah?
- What are some ways the story of Jonah lead to your story and how you respond to God?
- What next step will you take to resolve any tug of war with God you may be engaged in?
