

## **FOLLOW – PART 4: GREAT QUESTIONS** **SUNDAY, JUNE 27, 2021**

*Jesus' invitation to follow was & is for everyone. Yet following Jesus requires trust, which can sometimes be inconvenient, overwhelming and costly. Even Jesus' earliest follower wrestled with this tension. When Jesus asked them a question about following or unfollowing, one of Jesus' followers asked a great question that put everything in perspective – "To whom shall I go?"*

### **READ JOHN 6:1-71**

- Why might the crowd have gathered and followed Jesus to Capernaum?
- How might Jesus' analogy of bread connected with those who had been present when he fed 5,000 people?
- In what ways would it have seemed weird when Jesus connected bread to his flesh and blood?
- Why do you think many of his followers turned away and deserted him at this time?
- What are some ways that following Jesus might be or has been difficult from your perspective?
- When following Jesus seems difficult, what makes it easier (or at least tempting) to unfollow?
- What responses do the question, "Are you also going to leave?" evoke in you?
- What responses do Peter's question, "To whom would we go?" evoke in you?
- Why did Peter place so much confidence in what he believed and knew about Jesus? How would you describe your level of confidence in what you believe and know about Jesus?
- Do you agree that people will always choose to follow someone or something? Why or why not?
- How do you respond to the questions: If not Jesus, then who? If not following Jesus, then what?
- What next step will you take to move ask and answer, "to whom would I go"?
