READ 1 KINGS 17:1-24

- What are some ways times of scarcity impacts what you believe about God being a God who provides?
- Why do you think it's easier to believe in God being a God who provides after rather than before the provision?
- What are some reasons God might want to miraculously meet some needs in your life?
- Why do you think God often uses the seemingly unlikely source to be a God who provides?
- How have you seen God guide you to a place where he also provided for you?
- What are some ways God has used others to meet your needs?
- What are some ways God has used you to meet the needs of others?
- What are some of your needs? What are some of your wants? What is the difference between the two?
- What next step will you take to place your trust in God who provides?
