READ MATTHEW 2:13-23

- > Why would the birth of Jesus pose a threat to Herod?
- > What are some ways fleeing to Egypt would disrupt "home" for Joseph, Mary & Jesus?
- Do you think God still warns people today of impending danger? Why or why not? If so, what are some forms God's warnings take?
- > Why do you think Joseph had a sense of urgency to listen to God's warning?
- > What do you see the significance being of Jesus' birth and God becoming one of us?
- > How does Jesus' birth provide the pathway to "home" in relationship with God?
- > Why do you think people today lack a sense of urgency about relationship with God?
- > How would you describe your level of urgency about relationship with God?
- > How would you describe your level of urgency about others' relationship with God?
- > What next step will you take make God at home in your heart?
