- What are some ways people try to measure life in terms of the accumulation of money & stuff?
- What might Jesus suggest as an appropriate measure of life?
- Would you describe the problem of having "enough" as a rich people problem? What are some rich people problems you experience (even if you don't feel rich)?
- What priority and/or perspective did the farmer in Jesus' story have?
- Why did Jesus point out that someone else would own the accumulations in the barn? Why is that important to keep in perspective?
- What are some ways the pursuit of more push the wellbeing of others and relationship with God out of the equation?
- What do you think it means to have a rich relationship with God? Would you describe your relationship with God as rich? Why or why not?
- What next step will you take to accumulate a rich relationship with God?
